

Boy Scout Troop 93 Rules Uncasville, CT

New Scouts:

The troop will provide the green shoulder loops and the registration transfer fee for registered Webelos crossing over to the troop. If the scout is new to the scouting program, he will pay an initial registration fee prorated based on the number of months remaining in the year. The scout will be responsible for all other uniform items and his scout book.

Recharter:

Each scout will pay his own annual registration fee and Boy's Life subscription if desired. Registration fees for active adult leaders will be paid by the troop. Troop Dues will be waived for Eagle Scouts and any Scout that will be turning 18 y/o within the scouting season. All BSA fees for Scouts that remain active and are 18 by recharter will be paid by the Troop.

Scout Accounts:

Each scout will have an account maintained by the Treasurer. This account may be used by the scout for any camping costs, BSA activities or training and recharter fees. If the scout family does not ask for them, funds remaining in the account after the scout leaves the troop will go into the troop general fund. This will occur 90 days after the scout leaves or at the next recharter, whichever is later.

Eagle Court of Honor:

The troop will contribute up to \$100 toward the Eagle Court of Honor for each scout achieving the rank of Eagle. The Treasurer will place the \$100 into an Eagle Scout reserve fund after their successful board of review. The Troop will pay (up to \$35) for a 5 year membership into the National Eagle Scout Association (NESA). This is in addition to the Eagle award that the troop will provide. This duty will be carried out by the Eagle Scout Coordinator and will require the Eagle Scout to remain active in the Troop.

The following items will be provided by the troop:

Rank badges, recruiter patches, quality unit patches, merit badges, Class B uniform upon reaching the rank of Tenderfoot, patrol patches, leadership position patches, adult leader training (up to \$50), and neckerchief and slide during crossover.

Troop Funds:

Committee approval (at least three committee members) is required for equipment purchases >\$75 or for any non-troop related expenditures such as donations.

The Treasurer will maintain an equipment fund in which money will be placed for future equipment purchases and/or replacement. **20% of the annual dues** and a portion of Troop fundraisers, to be decided by the Committee, will be placed into this fund.

Standard campout fees:

Campout fees are \$15 per scout and \$8 for second scout/scouter attending up to a maximum of \$25 per family. The fee may be refunded if cancellation notification is made before the shopping is completed. The scouter fee will be waived for drivers transporting the troop to the campout. For trips greater than 50 miles away (100 miles round trip), the troop will reimburse “qualified” drivers for the cost of their gasoline. A “qualified” driver is a driver who is towing a trailer, transporting troop equipment, or transporting scouts.

Dues Annual dues are \$20 and will be collected with rechartering fees during each scouting season. This will be reviewed annually before rechartering to determine if a change is required.

Forms: A copy of the troop discipline policy and photo release will be reviewed and signed by each scout upon joining the Troop.
