



## TROOP 93 Uniform Standard

Boy Scouts and Scout leaders should proudly wear their uniform for all ceremonial and indoor activities, boards of review, and court of honors. Additionally, the uniform should be worn during special outdoor occasions, such as flag ceremonies, Scout shows, and special events during summer camp. The uniform should be clean and unwrinkled. Hats that have a scouting appropriate logo may be worn when specified.

In an effort to maintain a consistent and appropriate appearance within the troop the following uniform standard is in effect and shall be adhered to. The adult leadership may alter the policy when he/she deems it necessary.

**Troop Meetings**-Class A uniform shirt, jeans or khaki pants, cargo shorts are acceptable when weather permits, however, they must conform to the standard.

**Ceremonies**-(Court of Honor, Crossover, etc.)-Class A uniform shirt, troop neckerchief, green khaki type pants and sash. No Hats.

**Troop Camping**-Appropriate pants/shorts, class B gear is recommended (tee shirts, fleece, hoodies, etc.) and hiking shoes/boots.

**Summer Camp**-Class A & Class B T-Shirts are required for meals and other announced activities throughout the week.

**District Activities**-(Merit Badge College and/or functions)-Same as troop meetings, however the neckerchiefs will be included. Non-Scout hats, shirts, etc. not allowed.

## National BSA Uniform Expectations

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Uniforming is one of the eight *Methods* used to accomplish the Scouting Aims of Character, Citizenship, & Fitness.

The uniform makes the Scout troop visible as a force for good and creates a positive youth image in the community. Boy Scouts is an action program and wearing the uniform is an action that shows each Scout's commitment to the aims and purposes of Scouting. The uniform gives the Scout identity in a world brotherhood of youth who believe in the same ideals.

The uniform is practical attire for Scout activities and provides a way for Scouts to wear the badges that show what they have accomplished.

The Boy Scout Uniform has long served as an expression of a Scout's friendliness to all other Scouts regardless of whom they are or where they're from. The uniform represents Scouting's spirit of Equality and democracy, and identifies a boy as a brother to every other Scout. Wearing the uniform promotes comradeship, loyalty to one's patrol and troop, and public recognition of membership in the Boy Scouts of America.
